



### **Know the Founder**

Dr. Panjabrao, alias Bhausaheb Deshmukh was born at the illage Papad in the district of Amravati on December 27, 1898. By the time he passed away on April 10, 1965, he had laid a firm foundation for the dissemination of education among the downtrodden and the dispossessed of the region. He knew that prosperity would come only when the weapon of knowledge becomes available to all. For this purpose he made a small beginning with the establishment of the Shri Shivaji Education Society at Amravati in 1932.

The Society began with just one school and one hostel; but today it has grown into the biggest educational organization in Central India. It runs 269 educational institutes ranging from pre-primary to post graduate colleges covering almost all fields of format and informal education: Arts, Agriculture, Biotechnology, Commerce, Computers, Education, Engineering and Technology, Fine Arts, Horticulture, Low, Medicine, Microbiology, Physical Education and a host of related field.

Besides working tirelessly for the peasants of vidarbha, Dr. Deshmukh also Participated in the progress of the nation. His contributions were recognized when he was selected by Jawaharlal Nehru to the first Minister for Agriculture in the Union Cabinet. He dedicated all his talents and energy to the formulation and implementation of policies that would bring prosperity to agriculture and the Agriculturist. He established the 'Bharat Krushak Samaj' and launched a compaign colled 'Food for Millions' in 1955. He brought in the Japanese method of rice cultivation in 1958 and organized the World Agriculture Fair at Delhi in 1959 which was inaugurated by the then President of the US, Dwight Eisenhower. The Fair was Visted by dignitaries across the world, some of them being Nikita Khrushchev, the President of the USSR, Mr. Bulganin, Secretary of the Communist Party of Soviet Russia, Lord and Lady Mountbatten and many others. Dr. Deshmukh started the process for the establishment of agriulture universities allacross the country, and gave fillip to agricultural education, agricultural research and related extension activities. He wanted to ensurethat the final beneficiary of all this enterprise would be the ordinary farmers. He opened rural institutes that would train youngsters in the Engineering and technical aspects of farming. Dr. Deshmukh also made useful contributions as a member of the Draft Committee for the Constitution of the Republic of India chiared by Dr. B. R. Ambedkar.



### **About the Society**

The Shri Shivaji Education Society, Amravati is a premier educational institution of Central India with its branches in the Vidarbha region of Maharashtra. It is registered as a Public Charitable Trust (R.N. F/89). Its founder president was the late Dr. Panjabrao alias Bhausaheb Deshmukh who established various school, colleges, hostels and other teching and technical institutions and devoted all his energy for strengthening and enlarging the activities of the Shri Shivaji Education Society, Amravati.

The Society was registered in December 1932. In 1958, it had one primary school, seven middle school and colleges. Today it runs 24 senior colleges 54 jr. colleges, 75 middle schools, 35 hostels mainly in the region of Vidarbha but also in other parts of the state. The educational institutions cover areas like agriculture, arts, bio-technology, computers, education, physical education, engineering, horticulture, information technology, law, medicine, miro-biology and the pure sciences, it also runs a polytehnic for boys and girls at Amravati.

The Shivaji Education Society was founded by Dr. Panjabrao alias Bhausaheb Deshmukh in 1931-32. Along with other members, Bhausaheb devoted himself to educate the people by establishing schools and colleges far and wide in the Vidarbha region. The society was awarded Dr. Babasaheb Ambdkar 'Dalit Mitra' award in 1993-94 by the govt. of Maharashtra. In the year 1999-2000 the Society was awarded the 'Gadge Maharaj Memorial Award, on 5th September, 2000. The Govt. of Maharashtra declared the society as the 'Best Administered Society' in the state and bestowed upon it cash award of Rs. 1 lakh. In citation, the State Government formally recognized the seminal contribution made by the society in the field of eduction and cultural advancement.

The year 2023-24 celebrating 125th birth anniversery of Dr. Panjabrao alies Bhausaheb Deshmukh with 125th lecture series in Maharashtra at different colleges and live 'Krushi Mela' at Amravati. Minister of Finance, Govt. of India commencement 125 Rs. coin in the memory of Dr. Panjabrao Deshmukh.



### **Brief History**

The College was founded by a group of public-spirited citizens who recognised the need for large opportunities for University education. It was started at Wardha in 1935. as Wasudeo Arts College and shifted to Nagpur in 1942 and named National College.

Shri Shivaji Educatio Society, Amravati, took over the management of this College in 1949. In 1951, Late Shrimant Dadasaheb Dhanwated gave adonation of Rs. 60,000 to the Society for Dhanwate National College.

The College is affiliated to Nagpur University, Nagpur Since its establishment it is one of the premier and leading academic institution of Central India, having Arts and Commerce faculties upto Post-graduate level, imparting instructions in English and Marathi mediums and also conducting Post-graduate courses in certain allied disciplines, viz. M.B.A. and MCM, PGDCCA, B.J.M.A. (Mass Communication), B.Com. (Computer Application B.C.C.A.) and BBA in Dr. Panjabrao Deshmukh Institute of Management Technology & Research. The college, located in its sprawling building in Congress Nagar stands today as a living epitome of the realisation of the dream of its great founder, Dr. Panjabrao Deshmukh.

The motto of the College is 'सत्यं शिवं सुन्दरम'

### **Rules of Promotion for XI Standard**

The rules of Promotion for finalising the result of first year of Junior College (XI Standard) shall be under (vide Circular No. SB/BR, High Sec./6 dated 15th July, 1982, of Maharashtra state Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education. Pune). HSC 2012 (28/12) HSC-2 Date 28-02-2012.

- 1. A Candidate must secure minimum 35 marks out of 100 in each of the two compulsory Languages and in each of four optional subjects.
- 2. Marks for theory and practical in the subject where there are two parts should be taken together and the total marks will be considered for grade.
- 3. If a candidate appearing in all the subjects fails in one or more subjects, his deficiency of marks in one or more subjects to a maximum of 30 marks but not exceeding 10 marks in any one subject shall be condone for the purpose of passing the examination.
- 4. Although maximum 10 marks of condonation are to be given in one subject such concession should not exceed the required minimum percentage of passing in the subject, i.e. 35%
- 5. There shall not be any concession of A.T.K.T.
- 6. All the practicals prescribed for the course should as far as possible be completed by the student. However, they should complete atleast half the number of practicals prescribed for the course.
- 7. The result of the First Year Junior College (Std. XI) class shouldnot be decided on the marks obtained only in the second terminal examination. According to the modern trend of evaluation equal weightage shouldbe given to (a) The First Terminal Examination (b) The Second Terminal Examination and (c) Year's work practicals Unit tests, tutorials, etc. and the final resul of the student for each subject should be decided on average marks (a + b + c/2)
- 8. No candidate should be promoted to the next higher standard if he fails even after applying the rule of giving the benefit of condonation of marks as provided in rules of condonation.
- 9. Students failing at the examination of the First Year of Junior College i.e. Higher Secondary Std. XI are permitted to appear externally for the F.Y.J.C. Examination in the next October of March or thereafter. However, the question papers for such students shall be set on the entire portion prescribed in the Syllabus for Std. XI for the subjects concerned. Such of the students are permitted to region the Junior College and appears as regular student if they desire so.

### **Rules for Admission**

- 1. Online Admission via the college and University Website is must and get a printout there of.
- 2. Read the prospectus carefully, observe all the rules and regulation contained therein and make your parents / guardians aware of them, ignorance of the rules will be no excuse.
- 3. The Senior College will re-open on Thursday, 25th June 2023.
- 4. The admission form must be filled in carefully. All the required information must be given. If any information given therein is found to be false, incorrect or incomplete, the admission may be cancelled or the Principal may take such action as he deems fit.
- 5. The parents and guardians are requested to acquaint themselves with the rules and regulations of the College regarding payment of fees, attendance of classes, PT/N.C.C. and the Conduct Rules for the students given in Schedule "A" of the Prospectus. They are required to remain present at the time of the admission of their son/daughter/ward and sign the undertaking in the admission form. They are also requested to keep in constant touch with College authorities and the teachers concerned, ascertaining periodically the academic progress and general behaviour of their wards.
- 6. The College council is the final authority in various matters concerning the smooth functioning of the College and its academic standards. Hence any decision taken by the College Council regarding any of the items dealt with in the College Prospectus or otherwise, coming within the jurisdication of the College Council in the best interest of the students, teachers the Community at large, shall be collective and final and shall be binding on all concerned.
- 7. There shall be no Annual Social Gathering or College Day Celebration in the College but cultural and educational programmes Shall be observed.
- 8. The college does not accept responsibility for any accidents that may occur, in spite of reasonable precautions taken by the College.
- Every student should submit his/her two latest passport size photographs for the admission form and Identity Card.
- 10. No applicant for admission can claim admission as a matter of right on the basis of ex-studentship of this College. Once the public examinatin for which a student is admitted, is over, he/she shall cease to be a student of this College, whether he/she has actually appeared for the said examination or not and irrespectie of the fact that he / she has not taken his / her Transfer Certificate from the College.
- 11. Failure to appear for personal interview on the notified date and time of failure to fulfil the formalities required for admission, shall disqualify a student for admission. The College does not accept the responsibility of informing the applicants by post about their admission.



16. Admission will be finalised nd confirmed only on production of the originals of the above mentioned documents and on full payment of the prescribed fees, along with the undertaking and the declaration signed by the father guardian of the student, as per the rules and procedure laid down by the College.

- i) A student applying for admission to any class of thie College should get himself/herself satisfied whether he / she is eligible for admission to that particular class or not. - Withdrawal from the College Roll: A Student can withdraw his name from the College roll, by giving one month's notice either signed. by himself or by his father / guardian failing which one month's fee will be charged No transfer Certificate will be issued unless all the dues of the College are cleared.
- Removal from the College Roll: The name of a student may be removed from the College roll by the Principal, either acting within his own powersor as per the decision of the College Council if the student is found guilty of the breach of any of the rules of conduct for students mentioned in Schedule-'A' of the prospectus or any of the following acts of commission or omission.
- a) Failure to pay college dues within 15 days.
- b) Failure to come up to the academic standard.

- d) Failure to fulfil the minimum requirement of 75% attendance in lecture classes and 80% attendance in N.C.C./P.T.

- g) Adverse report from the staff.

The Academic Council of Rahtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj, Nagpur University, Nagpur has adopted the Government Resolution No. NEP-2020/09/-3/dated 20th April 2023 issued by the Government of Maharashtra in its meeting held on 21st April 2023 in view of imperentation of National Education Policy, 2020. The Faculty of Humanities, RTM Nagpur University has approved the following Teaching and Examination Scheme for 'Four Year - Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) Honours / Research Degree with Major and Minor' in its meeting held on 10th & 1th May 2023 & placed before the Chairpersons of All the Boards for consideration and approval in its meeting held on 29th May 2023. This notification is issued to facilitate the affiliated Colleges and Students for smooth conduct of admission process for the year 2024-25. Basic details required at the time of admission are provided in this notification and detailed Direction / Regulation containing comprehensive provisions related to all aspects shall soon be issued by the University. Further, a separate list of the 'Skill Enhancement Courses' and a list of 'Co-Curricular Course' shall also be soon issued by the University.

- 1. Details of eligibility for B.A. semester 1 examination
- a) For the B.A. 1st Semester, Examinee shall have Passed the 12th Standard Examination of the Maharashtra State board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education / CBSE / ICSE, in the faculity of Arts or faculty of Commerce or Faculty of Science, vocational stream, professional courses or an examination recognised as equivalent there to in such sujbects and with such standards of attainments as may be prescribed.

#### OR

b) 12th Standard Examination f Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education in Vocational Stream with one language only; OR any other examination reognized as equivalent there to in such subjects and with such standards of attainments as may be prescribed Minimum Competition vocation course (MCVC).

#### OR

- c) Any other Equivalent Examination of any State in (10+2) pattern with any combination of subjects.
- 2. Duration of the Program, student progression path and provisions for Multiple Entry and Exit.
- A) Duration of the B.A. Program shall be FOUR years with the prvision for multiple exit as mentioned here:
  - a) A student an exist the program after successful completion of 1st and 2nd semesters having earned requisite number of credits as mentioned in the scheme of examination and additional 'Skill Enhancement Course' with 4 credits. Such a student shall eligible for the award of 'UG Certificate in (Subject) by the University.
  - b) A student can exit the program after successful completion of 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th semesters having earned requisie number of credits as mentioned in the Scheme of examination and additional 'Skill Enhancement Course' with 4 credits. Such a student shall be eligible for the award of 'UG Diploma in (Subject)' by the University. OR a student can continue the program in 3rd year.
  - c) A student can exit the program after successful completion of 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th semesters having earned requisit number of credits as mentioned in the scheme of examination. Such a student shall be eigible for the award of **'Bachelor of Arts'** degree by the University.
    - **OR** a student can continue the program in 4th yar for either HONOURS or RESEARCH degree.
  - d) A student, on successful completion of all the 8 emesters and having earne requisite number of credits as mentioned in the scheme of examination shall be eligible for the award of either 'Bachelor of Arts (Honours) Degree with Major and Minor' OR' Bachelor of Arts (Research) Degree with Major and Minor'
- B. Re-entry or Lateral Entry
  - a) Students, opting for exits at any level, will have the option to re-enter the programme from where they have left off, in the same or in a different higher education institution within three years of exit and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of SEVEN years from the date of admission to first year.



- b) Re-entry at various levels for lateral entrants in academic programmes shall be based on the earned and valid credits as deposited and accumulated in the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) through Registered Higher Education institutions and proficiency test records.
- c) Lateral entry into the programme of study leading to the UG Diploma / Three Year UG Degree / Four Year Bachelor's Degree with Honus / Research will be based on the validation of prior learning outcomes achieved and subject to availability seats based on intake capacity.

- Failures seeking admission after a Gap of 1 or 2 yrs. and taking admission to higher class will have to submit fresh (New) application formfor all scholarships.

# college Scholarships

- 1. Dr. Panjabrao Deshmukh Memorial Other Backward Class & Open Merit Junior & Senior Scholarships.
  - These scholarships instituted for each of the facultis of the College, will be in two categories as under.
- Junior Scholarships: Three in Arts and Three in Commerce of Rs. 100/- p.m. for a duration of 10 months. Junior Scholarships will be awarded to those Other Backward Classstudents of the College who have passed the H.S.C. exam. of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary Education or the B.A. Part-I, B.Com, Part I, B.A. Part-II or B.Com. Part II Examination of Nagpur University, as students of this college obtaining the highest number of marks amongst the students or Backward Communities appearing at these examinations from the faculties of this College.
- **Senior Scholarships**: Two in Arts and two in Commerce of Rs.150/- p.m. for a duration of 10 months. Senior Scholarships will be awarded to those students of this College who have passed the B.A. Final, M.A. Part-I, B.Com Final, and M.Com Part-I Examinations of Nagpur University as students of this college obtaining the highest numbe of marks among the students appearing at these examinations from the faculties of this College.

The percentage of marks for these scholarships should be 60% or above for H.S.C. and 55% for B.A. Part-I and B.

A. Part - II and B.A. Final and M.A. Part-I classes in Arts and for Other Backward Classes Merit Scholarship, percentage of marks should be 50 or above.

The students obtaining any G.O.I. Scholarships will not ordinarily be entitled to apply for these scholarships.



- 2. ## **Concessions**

#### a) Siblings Concession

If two or more brothers or sisters are studying in the college at the same time, the elder or the eldest will be required to pay the full tuition fee while other or each of the others shall pay half of the tuition fee charged for the course/courses. This concession will be available only to those who have to pay fees in full and not to the E.B.C. or others non-fee paying categories.

#### b) For Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes & Nomadic Tribes

Scholorship for students belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes will be given by the State Government in due course provided they are not failures. However, they are required to fill in the prescribed from for scholarship (obtainable from the College Office) as soon as they are admitted to the College. Annual Income Limit Rs. 2,5000/-

#### c) Economically Backward Classes

Those whose annual income is less than Rs. 8,00,000/- are declared as economically backward. Their fees are being reimbursed by the State Government. ## **Special Instruction:**

- 1. The Principals Heads of the institutions should communcate the list of students admitted in their colleges / institutions to the university within 15 days from the last date of admission.
- 2. Students admitted after the last date as specified above shall not be considered for enrolment in the University and therefore, stall not permitted to appear at the university examination.
- 3. All government & other holidays are calculated on the basis of last year's statistics. It is likely to be same except small variations after the declaration by the government/authorities. The schedule of such holidays will be saperately notified by the university at the beginning of Calender year.
- 4. Theory and practical examinations may be held on Sunday with prior permission and intimation.
- 5. It is necessary by the principle / Head of the department to certify the number of actual teaching days conducted during the academic season.
- 6. All efforts should be made to achieve more than 180 teaching days in Annual pattern and 90 days per semester in Semester Pattern.
- 7. This schedule is applicable only for the entry level admissions to various courses excluding the course where notified separately.
- 8. Therefor the last date of admission for all courses where centralised admission process is adopted shall be notified separtely.
- 9. The last date of examinations from for CAP round admission will be 15 days from the last date of admissions.
- 10. In case, Admissions goerned by Condition Eligibility the last date of submission of examination form shall be within fiteen days after declaration of its qualifying examinations provided such students should have been admitted provisionally for its next higher academic session as per Direction No. 27 of 2008 and 6 of 2010.

Owing to the Pandemic situation, there is a possibility that this Acadmic Calender may require changes during its course of implementation in accordance with the normsand guidelines issued by the Government and other regulating bodies. # National Cadet Corps (NCC)/ Physical Training / National Service Scheme / Sports and Games

#### (Nagpur University Ordinance No. 3)

As per this Ordinance, only the under-graduate studentss in Commerce and Arts faculties shall be eligible to participate, at their option, in either of the following activities.

- i) National Cadet Corps.
- ii) Physical Training.
- iii) National Service Scheme

This option shall be mentioned in the College Admission Form. Students who once opt for N.C.C. or P.T. will not be allowed to change their option in the middle of the academic session.

#### **ENROLMENT**

The College provides N.C.C. Training to those who opt for N.C.C. All Students opting for N.C.C. must fill in the N.C.C. enrolment form separately at the time of Medical Examination and submit it to the N.C.C. Office of the College. They must also pay Regimental Fund of Rs.2/- and the amount of the group insurance premium, as prescribed by the N.C.C. authorities at the time of their enrolment Failure to take the kit will be amount to not joining N.C.C. Those students who are not considered fit for selection in N.C.C. will have to join P.T.

Students will not be allowed to enroll both in N.C.C. and in P.T. simultaneously. However, an N.C.C. cadet may be allowed to participate in games subject to the condition that he completes 80% attendance in N.C.C. attends the annual camps of exercise and fulfits any other conditions required.

The students with less than 80% attendance in N.C.C. parades will not be eligible to receive Washing, Polishing and Refreshment Allowance.

Students who opt for P.T. should contact the College Physical Education Teachers and get their names registered in the College P.T. register which has to be maintained by the Physical Education Teacher (P.E.T.) The College P.E.T. shall report the names of such students enrolled in P.T. on or before 5th August 2021 Dt. Lt. S.S. Dadhe Dept. of Physical Education is the N.C.C. Officer of the College.

## ATTENDANCE IN N.C.C./P.T./N.S.S.

Students joining N.C.C. must attend at least 80% of the parades and the annual camp exercise. An N.C.C. cadet who fails to comply with the conditions stated above shall not be admitted to an examination of the university.

The condition of 80% attendance holds equally good in the case of students opting for P.T. Students in the morning shift shall not be allowd to join any N.C.C. unit in which parades are held in the morning during the teaching hours of the College.

#### NOTE:

- a) Principal of the College shall at his discretion, grant exemption from attending P.T. Classes as well as physical efficiency tests to those students who reside at the distance of more than 5 miles from the College and
- b) The married women students in the College shall be exempted from attending the P.T. classes as well as physical efficiency tests.

Every student who opts for N.C.C. and is accepted for enrolment in the Senior Division Army Wing shall be enrolled for a period of three years and every student accepted for enrolment in the Senior Division Air Wing or Senior Division Naval Wing shall be enrolled for the period of three years as long as he is on the roll of the College. **The College provides training facilities only in Army Wing.** Permission of the Principal is necessary in case a student is seeking enrolment in an N.C.C. wing other than the Army Wing of the College, which will be granted if the parades of such a Wing are not held during College hours. Students who apply for admission in a technical unit and are rejected, will be required to join either N.C.C. Army Wing N.S.S./P.T. on or before 5-8-2023.

The period of N.C.C. Training or physical training shall be from 25th July, 2023 to 31st January 2024.

All cadets must get certified as meically fit by the College doctor at the medical examination before enrolment.

Students seeking enrolment in N.C.C. will have to fill in a separate N.C.C. enrolment form.

The same will be filled in at the time of medical examination of the College. The medical fitness certificate of the College doctor in the N.C.C. enrolment form will be signed at the time of medical examination. Medical examination is compulsory for all students on the roll of the College as per University Act.

## RETURN OF N.C.C. KIT

All the N.C.C. cadets shall return their kits and any other N.C.C. property entrusted to them, in good condition, to the Commanding Officer by 25th February 2024 positively, failling which they may be debarred from appearing at the university examination.

## LADY STUDENTS (N.C.C./P.T.)

N.C.C. is optional for the lady students. Lady students not joining N.C.C. and found medically fit shall enrol themselves for Physical Training or N.S.S.

## ATTENDANCE P.T.

All undergraduate students (in Arts and Commerce faculties) in the College who opt for Physical Training shall attend Physical Education classes, 3 periods in a week with a minimum of 60 periods in a session. Every student must attend at least 80% of the Physical Training periods held in a session.



#### **EXEMPTION FROM N.C.C./P.T.**

The following students are exempted from N.C.C or physical training.

- 1. Students of M.Com., M.A.B. Com. Final and B.A. Final classes.
- 2. Students having completed the age of 25 years at the time of admission to the College.
- 3. Students found unfit on medical grounds and so recommended by the Medical Officer of the College and the principal with detailed reasons for unfitness.
- 4. Students participating in (i) Inter-Collegiate (ii) Inter-University or (iii) State-level Tournaments.
- 5. Students who have completed N.C.C. training for three yers and have attended at least one camp, on production of such service certificate from the Unit/Units concerned.
- 6. Students who attend outdoor sports under supervision of College P.E.T. (Physical Education Teacher) and as certificated by the College P.E.T.
- 7. Students who attend a recognised course in mountaineering during the year.

  There is no exemption from P.T./N.C.C. to such students as are earning while learning.

A Student who desires to claim exemption on either or the grounds as specified above must apply to the Principal on or before 5th August 2023. The application for exemption should be enclosed with the admission form and accompanied by the necessary certificate. The decision of the Principal on the exemption application shall be final. The list of exempted Students shall be pasted on the College notice board.

All Students must read notices pasted on College notice board concerning N.C.C./P.T./N.S.S.

## **Facilities For Students**

## PHYSICAL EFFICIENCY TESTS

All students on the roll of the College including those who have opted for N.C.C. or P.T. and students for inter-College Gymnasium or Mountaineering Course or attending outdoor games shall present themselves for Physical Efficiency Tests before the committee or examiners on such daes and at such time as may be fixed by the Principal. Physical Efficiency Tests shall be conducted in the month of January/February every year.

Candidates successful at the Physical Efficiency Test shall be placed in Grades 'A' and 'B' and shall receive certificate signed by the Principal.

If a students fails to present himself at the Physical Efficiency Test and the Medical Examination without sufficient cause, he shall to pay to the College a fine of Rs.05/-

## **GAMES AND SPORTS**

The College has big and well-maintained playgrounds, one in the College premises and another in Vasant Nagar. It has a glorious tradition in the filled of games and sports. it is expected that maximum number of students, both boys and girls, will take part in these activities, during their leisure time, enabling the selectors to pick up the best talents for competitive events and tournaments. The



selection of the players for various teams & competitive events will be made by a Selection Committee constituted by the Sports Coucil of the Collegr. The College teams will participate in the tournaments organised at the Universities. State and National Level for by Association.

Its object is to develop multi-diciplinary approach and aesthetic taste. It has the track record of winning university prize annually.

## The Code of Conduct for Students

The following rules have been framed by the the College Council for the maintenance of discipline in the College.

- Every Student should obey all orders of the Principal, either general or specific. They will be directly answerable to him for their behaviour in general both inside and outside the College. The names of such students as will be found breaking the rules of the College administration or behaving in an indisciplined manner will be removed from the College roll. It will be presumed on admission that they have read and agreed with these rules.
- The students shall beave respectfully with their lecturers and politely with their fellow-students, espectfully girls. Any act of disobedience before lecturers, improper and indecent exchange of words or the passing of any indecent remarks specially at the girl students will be punishable offence.
- 3. Smoking, spitting, taking of any hard drinks in College premises, chewing and whistling in classrooms are strictly prohibited. Students are, therefore, warned not to indulge in such activities.
- 4. Students are expected to occupy their seats in their respective classrooms before their lecturer steps in and should not unnecessarily loiter in the College premises after the period bell has ring. They should also be punctual. They shall not leave the classroom on any account while the period is going on. They should bring Text-Books in all Language classes.
- 5. No student shall attend classes other than his own and shall bring any companion with him who is not a student of this college.
- 6. During the time of a lecture, all students are expected to be fully responsive to class instructions given by their lecturer and should not create disturbance there on any account. Off periods may be spent by them either in the Reading Room or their respective Common Room (boys & girls') so that a dignified silence prevails in College premises.



- 7. An application requesting leave on medical grounds especially at the time of College examination will be treated as invalid if not accomparied by a medical certificate issued by a Government-recognised Doctor. For leave during the period of examination, a certificate of the College doctor will only be accepted. It may be noted here that every student shall have to pay Re.1/- per period for remaining absent at periods during any working day. Non attendance at the Tutorial classes will entail a line of Rs. 2/- per period.
- 8. The annual medical examination will enable the College authorities to detect cases of students suffering from contagious diseases, if any. Student found affected will not be permitted to attend College until such time as they are completely cured and a Government-recognised doctor confirms their physical fitness to attend College.
- 9. Students shall see that they use College books, rooms, furniture, fans and the College property in general most carefully. The cost of the damage done to it shall be recoverable from students either individually or collectively as the case may be.
- 10. Only special notices shall be read out in classrooms. Students are therefore, expected to see the Notice Board daily and keep themselves well-informed of the various notices that may be put up there from time to time.
- 11. Any change either in the local or permanent address of a student should be notified to the Admission Clerk promptly so that normal contact with him is not interrupted.
- 12. On admission, every student shall obtain from the College Office an Identify Card carrying his/her own passport size photograph duly pasted upon it and attested by the proper authority and shall preserve this card carefully with him/her in order to produce it on demand as and when required. In case of loss, it can only be replaced on payment of Rs. 20/- (Twenty) only. Every student must bring the Identify Card with him/her whenever he/she comes to College. Any student failing to produce the Identity Card on demand may be treated as a trespasser. All the students will havetoreturntheir identity Cards to the clerk concerned at the time of receiving their Admission Cards for the university examination.
- 13. No students shall directly send anything concerning the College for publication either to the press or elsewhere without the prior approval of and necessary permission from the Principal of the College, nor shall he approach the President or the Governing Body Members, except through the College Principal. Any breach of this rule may lead to outright expulsion of the student from the College.
- 14. Any difficulty, which the student might face, should be brought to the notice of the Principal in writing through the Superintendent of the College with remarks in writing.
- 15. Students are not authorised to form unions or societies in the College without the peior conset of the Professor incharge of the societies concerned. They shall also not invite guests or arrange their lectures on their own initiative, without prior permission of the Prof-in-charge concerned.
- 16. Any direct action on the part of the students, like morcha College bandh, boycotting of classes, strike etc, without prior written intimation of at least 15 days to the College authorities will be viewed as a serious breach of discipline and strict action will be taken against the student indulging in such activities.
- 17. Any change from one section to another or any change in of faculty, subject, medium or in respect of N.C.C./P.T. will not be allowed in any case whatsoever.



- 18. 75% attendance in classes is compulsory as per university rules failing which. He/she may not be allowed to fill in the examination form and such candidate will be treated as detained.
- 19. Any breach of the above rules will amount to an offence, punishable according to the degree of its seriousness. The Principal's decision in this matter will be final.
- 20. Any student who leaves college after admission for any reason shall have to pay tution & other less for the whole session.
- 21. Students shall keep their two wheeler vehicles on the cycle stand properly locked. An unlocked vehicle shall not be allowed. Every Saturday shall be observed as no vehicle day both for staff and students.
- 22. If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if his explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expet him from the institution. As per government regulation, Ragging is prohibited.
- 23. The concept of green campus has been adopted by the college to conserve environment.
