

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

This policy applies to all faculty members and the college administration of Dhanwate National College, Nagpur.


Definition:

2. College Support:


- a) The college administration should provide necessary resources, such as technology, learning aids, and support staff, to facilitate the implementation of the above strategies.

Advanced Learners: Students who demonstrate exceptional intellectual abilities and have a faster understanding and learning pace compared to their peers.


Policy Guidelines:

- Faculty members should encourage advanced learners to read research papers and make presentations before the class, promoting their ability to analyze complex information and articulate their ideas effectively.

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
