

Ambhora temple is unique in terms of natural beauty and culture.</p> <p>As the inscription in the Harinath temple says, '<i>Vivek Sindhu</i> was written here by the first poet of Marathi, <i>Shri Mukundraj</i>.'</p> <p>This book was created by <i>Shri Mukundraj</i> during the year 1110. This entire book is written on <i>Bhoja Patras</i>. In this book, Shankaracharya's Vedanta has been expounded. The book has a total of eighteen chapters, and the book is composed in the genre of poetic nature. Ambhora city has such a long history</p> <p>The second destination of the tour was Gosikhurd i.e. "<i>Indira Sagar</i>" dam near Pavani town. It is the largest dam in the entire Vidarbha and has got the status of a national project. Bhandara, Gondia, Chandrapur and Nagpur districts have benefited from irrigation due to this dam.</p> <p>Along with irrigation, this project also generates electricity.</p> <p>The third destination of the tour was the Golden Buddhist Stupa at Pavani.
