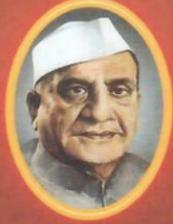

Introduction

The institution has very effective internal co-ordination and monitoring mechanisms. The Principal of the college takes initiative to ensure effective co-ordination between and among the functionaries of the college. On the basis of various policies formulated, objectives are laid down and plans made, a regular follow-up is maintained, thereby encouraging greater support and co-ordination. The heads of departments and teachers co-ordinate and plan their individual departmental activities and report to the Principal accordingly. The non-teaching staff also works under the instructions of the Principal and the Registrar, thereby coordinating the entire administration work.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell co-ordinates and monitors the various activities. The different reports such as departmental reports, supports services reports, performance appraisal reports, self-appraisal reports, college annual reports, directives from government etc. become the base for analysing and evaluating the overall performance of the Institution. This also forms the basis for the future plan of action.

The perspective institutional plan is developed by the Principal in consultation with members of the Management, IQAC, Heads of various Departments and the Registrar, who is the administrative head. On the basis of the admission schedule, the number of teaching days and examination schedule, convenor of the academic committee prepares academic cell for the academic year. Heads of the Departments include a list of the pre-planned lectures, oral and virtual, curricular, co-curricular, extra-curricular skill based activities to be conducted. It is prepared in consultation with teachers and administrators, and hence they are automatically involved in the planning process. These plans are improved regularly to ensure quality development of the College.

The Managing Council of society controls and plans the finance and approves the schemes of development.


The Principal is involved in overlooking the implementation of the plans of the College. They ensure that regular day to day operations are properly conducted, through feedback from convenors, teaching and non-teaching staff. IQAC formulates quality initiatives as directed by NAAC and implements quality parameters criteria-wise. All the seven criteria incharges are conscious of strategy development and its deployment.

The Local Management Committee is the Statutory Body, formed as per Section 85 of the Maharashtra Universities Act, 1994. The powers and duties of LMC are stated in the same. The LMC comprises elected representatives of teaching and non-teaching staff, Chairman, Secretary and a representative of Management and experts from various fields. This Committee can make recommendations for the improvement and up gradation of existing academic, curricular, co-curricular, extra-curricular activities.

The Heads of Departments ensure that the plans communicated to them by the Principal are implemented systematically. Committees for co-curricular and extra-curricular activities are formed at the beginning of the year and are assigned the tasks according to the institutional plans

Examination and Evaluation Committee, Library Committee, Discipline and Anti- ragging committees, Student Aid and Scholarship Committee, Internal Complaint and Redressal Committee, Sports Council administrate various terrains at institutional level for the smooth conduct of all administrative activities according to requirements of academic bodies and government rules, there are Committees headed by senior faculty to guide the function.

Strengths

Colossal infrastructure facilities developed over a period of time especially separate building for different programmes along with sports infrastructure; including, indoor stadium, solar plant, 03 seminar halls, computer labs, guest house and multi-language lab. Centrally location and accessible location through road, air and rail modes of transportation.

Great lineage of Principals and teachers with academic excellence, awards and recognition. Book publication by teachers, Research in sub-altern areas / contemporary issues and research guides and PhD awardees.

Weaknesses

The quality of intake is poor in terms of the English-speaking ability of our students alongwith their general awareness levels. This requires additional efforts on our part.

The institution is academically dependent on university. For example; the syllabus strictly required to be followed as prescribed by the university. The content in many programmes donot match the employer expectations and many a times it is outdated.

The region is industrially backward resulting in lower employment opportunities to the outgoing students.

Opportunities

Industrial development of the city is the biggest opportunity. Nagpur is fast growing in terms of city infrastructure and new industrial units. This in-turn shall be beneficial towards better employment opportunities for our students.

Many new professional training institutions are coming-up in the city resulting in better skill development relevant to industry requirements.

The new metro railway station in front of the institution shall make our central location of the institution more attractive.

Challenges

To compete with private universities along with arrival of foreign universities in India in recent times

To run self-financed courses is becoming challenging because of the fluctuations in the quality and quantity of student intake

QUALITY IMPROVEMENT STRATEGIES

The taking over of Shri Shivaji Maratha High School and the Shri Shivaji Maratha Hostel led to the modest beginning, the founder being none other than Dr. Panjabrao alias Bhausaheb Deshmukh. Bhausaheb Deshmukh was an erudite scholar of Sanskrit, Parliamentarian, Agriculturist, Educationist and Social Reformer. He was the first Union Agriculture Minister of Independent India.

Today, the Society is proud to be one of the biggest Education Societies in Central India with various colleges, training centers, schools and kindergartens, hostels, printing press, gymnasium, health clubs under its wings. The society also boasts of a 150 bedded Hospital and a Medical Research Centre making a total of 269 service institutions striving towards the social cause and making it one of the biggest education societies of Maharashtra. 

The Society was awarded Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar 'Dalit Mitra' Award during 1993-94 by the Govt. of Maharashtra. In the session 1999-2000 the Society was awarded the 'Gadge Maharaj Memorial Award, on 5th September, 2000 the Govt. of Maharashtra declared the Society as the "Best Administered Society" in the state and bestowed upon it a cash award of Rs. 1 lakh. 



- To provide prompt counselling for any emotional emergencies arising on account of any events at the campus








Constitutional Provisions for SC / ST:

The safeguards for the protection of interests of Sc / ST are mandated in the following provisions of Constitution of India:

- i. **Article 341 and 342** - Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes have been identified as the two most backward groups of Indian Society. They include all such castes, races or tribes, which have been declared as scheduled castes and scheduled tribes by the Constitution of India under the provisions of Article 341 and 342 of the Constitution of India.
- ii. **Article 15 (1) & (2)** - Prohibition of discrimination against citizens on grounds of religion, race, caste, sex or place of birth.
- iii. **Article 16(1)&(2)** - Citizens' right to 'equality of opportunity' in matters relating to employment or appointment to any office under the State, and prohibition in this regard of any discrimination on grounds of religion, race, caste, sex or place of birth.
- iv. **Article 16(4)** - Equality of opportunity in matters of public employment - Nothing in this Article shall prevent the State from making any provision for the reservation of appointments or posts in favor of any backward class or citizens, which, in the opinion of the State, is not adequately represented in the services under the State.
- v. **Article 25(1)** - People's freedom of conscience and right to freely profess, practice and propagate religion – subject to public order, morality and other Fundamental Rights.
- vi. **Article 26** - Right of every religious denomination or any section thereof – subject to public order, morality and health – to establish and maintain institutions for religious and charitable purposes, manage its own affairs in matters of religion, and own and acquire movable and immovable property and administer it in accordance with law.
- vii. **Article 28** - People's freedom as to attendance at religious instruction or religious worship in educational institutions wholly maintained, recognized, or aided by the State.
- viii. **Article 29(2)** - Non-denial of admission to any citizen to any educational institution maintained or aided by the State, on grounds only of religion, race, caste, language or any of them.
- ix. **Article 335** - This article claims of the members of the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes shall be taken into consideration, consistently with the maintenance of efficiency of administration, in the making of appointments to services and posts in connection with the affairs of the Union or State.

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ANTI-RAGGING POLICY

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 'Merit' and 'Ethics' being the core driving values towards turning out professionals of high caliber with strong sense of ethical judgments, social integration of student's population coming from different parts of the country with most diverse cultural and social back grounds, becomes a matter of prime importance. 'Ragging' a social menace, as such has no place in academic environment of the college and concerted efforts are required to be in place to prevent its occurrence at any point of time. Hence the need for a balanced 'Anti-Ragging Policy' to be adopted by the college.

1.2 Hon'ble supreme court of India, during December 2007 has expressed concern over the incidents of ragging occurring in higher educational institutions and the need to eliminate it altogether.

1.3 The ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India has taken a serious note of the incidents of ragging and is of the view that stern action should be taken against those indulging in "ragging" so that these incidents are not repeated and exemplary punishment is meted out to those indulging in it. Strict implementation of the guidelines issued by Hon'ble Supreme Court on this issue has also been stressed by the Ministry.

1.4 Ragging is a criminal offence and lowers the standards of education. The 'anti-ragging policy' adopted by the institute takes care of preventive, procedural and punitive aspects of ragging based on the guidelines provided by Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, recommendations of the Raghavan Committee, instruction/guidelines issued by the Ministry of HRD (Govt. of India).

2. ANTI-RAGGING POLICY

2.1 Adopted by the institute therefore is aimed at:

- (a) Creation, development and nurturing a conducive, socio-academic environment within the student population.
- (b) Generating and maintain a high level of confidence within new entrants and their parents/guardians to perceive that fresh entrants to the college are welcome and provided support, rather than being harassed and intimidated.
- (c) Keeping in place an integrated system to discourage and prevent any negative acts like ‘ragging’ by the senior, which disrupts socio-academic integration of new entrants.
- (d) Prescribing deterrent measures for any violation of the “Anti-Ragging Policy” by way of disciplinary measures.

3. DEFINITIONS

3.1 For the purpose of this policy the following are defined as under:-

‘College’ means “Dhanwate National College”, Congress Nagar, Nagpur

‘Students’ includes any person who is enrolled for nay course, whether full time or part time with the institute. This also includes research associates/scholars or a visitor, and/or a repeater.

‘Hostel’ includes the place/(s) where students are accommodated through institutional arrangement.

‘Ragging’ constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- (a) A conduct by any student or a group of students whether by words spoken or written or ty an act which has the effects of teasing, treating or handling any other student with rudeness.
- (b) Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by a students or group of students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to rise fear or apprehension there of in any other students.
- (c) Asking a student to do any act which the student will not carry out in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such student(s).

- (d) Any act by a student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student(s).
- (e) Exploiting the services of any student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- (f) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a student by any other student or a group of students.
- (g) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person.
- (h) Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, posts, social networking posts, e-posts, public insult which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from activity or passively participating in the discomfiture to a students(s).
- (i) Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by any student or a group of students over any other student(s)

4. PREVENTIVE ASPECTS OF RAGGING

4.1 Systemized Efforts for Socio-Academic Integration of New Entrants.

(a) Address by the Competent Authorities of the College.

The principal, Dean Academics, Chairperson Admissions, Chairperson Academic Programmes and other concerned official(s) during their address/discussions to/with parents/guardians, admission aspirants/fresh entrants/ students at the time of counselling meets, new batch induction on registration, batch inaugurals and other such occasions, should invariably assure the students and parents about full protection and support against any attempts of ragging by seniors while briefly introducing to ‘Anti Ragging Policy’ of the College. The efforts during such meets be directed towards achieving socio-academic integration of new entrants with the specific merit-oriented environment of mutuality and trust of the college.

(b) New Batch Inaugurals

The principal and faculty members, during new batch inaugurals may provide to the students, the guidelines on expected behavioral norms wherein a mention to the

Anti Ragging Policy may be made.

(c) Welcome Party for New Entrants

Senior students shall be encouraged to organize a “Welcome Party” for new entrants. For the said purpose an organizing committee may be constituted comprising of selected senior students of which, a senior faculty member will be the Ex-Officio-Chairman cum Patron. The Chairperson Student Affairs and faculty members, to the extent possible, should participate in such a party.

(d) Mentoring Cells

‘Mentoring Cell’ shall function under the guidance of a Senior Faculty and in direct supervision of the ‘Chairman, Student Affairs’. Such a cell would be manned by senior students. There should be one senior student mentor for a specified group of 10 junior students. Membership to the ‘mentoring cell’ by senior students would be on voluntary basis by inviting applications and nominating membership on year-to-year basis.

The senior student mentor will also monitor ‘psychological behavior/behavioral aberration of new students. If any abnormal behavior or environmental adjustment problem observed, the same shall be reported to the ‘chairman, Student Affairs’.

(e) Social, Cultural, Sports Activities

The membership of all students’ clubs and committees will be coordinated on the lines of this (proposed anti-ragging) policy. The induction process to all students’ clubs and committees will be organized in line with the proposed anti-ragging policy.

(f) Watch and ward Arrangements

The institute has identified following vulnerable locations

- i. Hostel blocks and mess
- ii. Vacant class rooms
- iii. Auditorium
- iv. Canteen
- v. Playground/Gymnasium
- vi. Student activity centers
- vii. Favorite joints of students in the vicinity

All concerned are to keep a constant vigil and watch at such locations including monitoring of the atmosphere and the environment at eating ‘Joints’ (Canteens, Mess etc.), Hostel/ accommodations, where students are accommodated.

These areas are needed to be carefully guarded if required by posting security personnel.

4.2 Wide – Dissemination of Anti-Ragging Policy

Prospectus and Admission Forms

- i. All Prospectus should contain a specific caution that “ragging is banned in the college, and anyone found indulging in ragging, is likely to be punished appropriately which may include expulsion from the college”.
- ii. All students of the college are required to sign an anti-ragging declaration form (Annexure I and II) at the time of admission to the college.

Erection of Posters

Academic programme office may put up posters in prominent places within the campus to exhort students to prevent, or not to indulge in ragging, also mentioning the names of the officials and their contact numbers, to be contacted in case of “ragging”. The same needs to be displayed on the website of the college.

5. MONITORING ASPECTS OF RAGGING

5.1 Anti-Ragging Surveys

Anonymous random surveys, across first year students be carried out every fortnight, during first three months, at all the constituents of the college, to verify and check, whether the campus is indeed free from ‘ragging’.

5.2 Anti-Ragging Committee (ARC) at the Institute Level

An Anti-Ragging Committee (ARC) should be constituted at college level to monitor the various aspects related to menace of ragging. The members of this committee can be nominated by the principal of college (of which one has to be necessarily a female member). The ARC may have ‘Dean – Academics’ as chairperson and may also comprise of Chairperson Student affairs, Chairperson Academic Programme and all hostel wardens as tother members in order to carry out the compliance of this policy across the whole institute along with the manner in which the same are dealt with.

6. PROCEDURAL AND PUNITIVE ASPECTS OF “RAGGING”

6.1 First Information Person (FIP)

- (a) ‘First Information Person (FIP) would be nominated by the college at beginning of each academic year. The FIP would provide first instance intervention in case of any complaint of “Ragging”
- (b) FIP will also need to co-ordinate the preventive aspects of ragging, under guidance of the Chairperson ARC aiming the create a “Ragging Free Environment”.
- (c) FIP will be responsible for taking steps to ensure that cases of “Ragging” within the college are brought to the notice of the Chairperson ARC as soon as possible.

6.2 Ragging Reporting Procedure

- (a) ARC will investigate all reported cases of ragging, in such a way, so as to maintain confidentiality to the extent practicable under the circumstances. The investigations should start maximum within three (03) days of reporting the incident and reports finalized by the ARC pinpointing the involvement of the accessed along with recommendations relating to the punishment will be submitted to the competent authority maximum within a period of four (04) weeks. In exceptional circumstances, the Chairperson ARC may grant extension to the time limit under information to the complainant and the accused.
- (b) FIP or member/s of the ARC will also be available to discuss any concerns exhibited by any student or a group of students, about ragging.
- (c) All formal/informal complaints of “Ragging” may be made to the FIP within the constituent unit or directly to Chairperson ARC as stated above.

6.3 ARC as Enquiry Committee

ARC will investigate all reported cases of ragging, in such a way, so as to maintain confidentiality to the extent practicable under the circumstance. The investigations should start maximum within three (03) days of reporting the incident and reports finalized by the ARC pinpointing will be submitted to the competent authority maximum within a period of four (04) weeks. In exceptional circumstances, the Chairperson ARC may grant extension to the time limit under information to the complainant and the accused.

6.4 Process of Enquiry

The process of enquiry should be such to ensure that principles of natural justice are adhered to. Details of the process would be identical as in the case of 'Sexual Harassment Policy' adopted by the institute. If the ragging also includes an element of sexual committee (ICC) will look in to the matter independently of each other.

6.5 Punishment / Penalties for 'Ragging'

Based on the report of enquiry submitted by the ARC, the Chairperson ARC will recommend to the competent authority any of the punishment/(s) listed below or any other kind of punishment, which she/her may consider to be appropriate.

- (a) Withholding scholarships or other benefits
- (b) Debarring from representation of events.
- (c) Withholding results
- (d) Expulsion from institute
- (e) Debarring from examination/s
- (f) Suspension from the institute or class for a limited period
- (g) Fine with public apology
- (h) Prosecuting for criminal offence
- (i) Filing FIR with the local police
- (j) Cancellation of admission

6.6 Appeal


Appeal with regards to any action taken against the accused at any level and / or against the punishment awarded under this policy, shall lie with the principal of the college, which should be filed within a period of two weeks from such an action or awards of punishment.

7. SAVING AND REPEAL CLAUSE

Principal of the college will possess the sole authority for any interpretation, modification or amendment to the policy dependent upon the need from time to time. She/He will also possess powers to exercise her/his discretion with respect to any or all of the clauses of this policy.

- (iv) Article 26 - Right of every religious denomination or any section thereof – subject to public order, morality and health – to establish and maintain institutions for religious and charitable purposes, manage its own affairs in matters of religion, and own and acquire movable and immovable property and administer it in accordance with law.
- (v) Article 28 - People's freedom as to attendance at religious instruction or religious worship in educational institutions wholly maintained, recognized, or aided by the State.
- (vi) Article 29(2) - Non-denial of admission to any citizen to any educational institution maintained or aided by the State, on grounds only of religion, race, caste, language or any of them.
- (vii) Article 30(1) - Right of all religious and linguistic minorities to establish and administer educational institutions of their choice.
- (viii) Article 30(1A) - State laws providing for compulsory acquisition of property of minority educational institutions shall ensure that compensation amount to be paid does not restrict or abrogate the right guaranteed above.
- (ix) Article 30(2) - Freedom of minority-managed educational institutions from discrimination in the matter of receiving aid from the State.
